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#### Southern Tier AIDS Program (STAP)


- Has served the Southern Tier for almost 40 years
- · Currently serves eight counties
  - Broome, Chemung, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Otsego, Tioga, Tompkins
- Prevention Services
  - HIV, STI testing, HIV PrEP and Hep C consultation, navigation services (insurance, housing, and more)
- Client Services
  - Health Homes Care Management, Supported Housing, Ryan White Case Management, Re-Entry Program

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#### Broome County Health Department (BCHD)

- Mission
  - Broome County Health Department serves our residents by promoting and protecting public health through education and prevention
- Immunization Activities
  - Long-standing immunization clinic, currently held weekly
  - Return to community-based vaccine clinics during COVID-19



#### A Partnership is Born


- STAP received a grant from NYSDOH/ AIDS Institute to provide mpox education and outreach
  - Funds supported incentives and activities to facilitate vaccination (e.g. transportation assistance)
- STAP does not have ability to vaccinate or store vaccine, so BCHD was brought in

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#### Outreach

- Target Populations
  - LGBTQ+ community
  - People of color
  - People living with HIV/ AIDS
- Outreach Methods
  - Table at events
  - Partner with community organizations
  - · Promote through other STAP programs
  - · Paid ads on Grindr
  - Social media campaign (funded by Community Foundation of South Central New York)







- 20 clinics held in Broome County\*
- STAP
  - Provided incentives (usually grocery or gas gift cards) for vaccination
  - Held STI testing clinics in conjunction with vaccination events to increase reach
- BCHD
  - Supplied JYNNEOS vaccine
  - Provided clerical staff and nurse vaccinators
  - Set up the online registration and screening form in CDMS (Communicable Disease Management System)

\*STAP held more mpox clinics in other counties, in conjunction with other LHDs

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- Appointments every 10 minutes
- · Clerical staff
- Acted as greeters
  - Completed the CDMS consent/vaccine records, patient vaccine records
  - Recorded vaccine doses for the vaccinees' vaccine cards.
  - Accessed NYSIIS and NYC CIR for those getting second doses without hard copies of previous doses from other sites



- Originally, as advised by NYSDOH, the vaccine was administered via the intradermal route to maximize the vaccine supply
  - JYNNEOS supplied in 0.5 ml vials
  - Intradermal dose = 0.1 ml, so potentially 5 doses per vial
  - Subcutaneous dose = 0.5 ml
  - BCHD did not have low dead space tuberculin syringes so we usually got only 4 full doses from each vial
- BCHD has three nurses long experienced in administering intradermal injections (for Tb skin testing). ID injections are the technically most difficult of all injections to administer correctly. Not a procedure that lends itself to just-in-time training
- All 3 nurses volunteered to be vaccinators for this initiative

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### Challenges to Vaccination


- Community perception that mpox is not a high priority
- Limited opportunities to get mpox vaccine (not available at most primary care locations or pharmacies)
- 3. LHD staffing levels
- Large portion of target population already received mpox vaccine at beginning of 2022 outbreak



## Impact in Broome County


- Administered 357 total doses from August 2022 to September 2023
  - 211 first doses
  - 146 second doses

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#### **Next Steps**

- STAP's grant funding has ended
- Community-based clinics to continue at local colleges/ universities in Fall 2023
- BCHD has integrated mpox vaccination into its weekly STI clinic



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
