Title V Funding

- NYSDOH receives federal funding from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).
 - Title V Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG)
 - 30% of MCHSBG funds to support programs across New York State
 Department of Health (NYSDOH) that serve CYSHCN
 - \$6.2 million supports CYSHCN programs administered by 52 counties state-wide, including NYC and three Regional Support Centers (RSCs)





NYSDOH CYSHCN Program

- Administered by the Bureau of Child Health in the Division of Family Health
- Contract with 52 counties/local health departments (LHDs) statewide including NYC
 - Information and referrals for CYSHCN and families
 - Help navigate and access complex networks of medical, developmental and social-emotional care in NYS
- Contract with University Centers for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities (aka. RSCs)



LHD CYSHCN Staffing

A <u>dedicated</u> staff person (funded or unfunded) at each county is responsible for meeting program deliverables. This <u>required</u> staff person is the point person who is accessible to NYSDOH, parents, medical providers, service providers, school district staff, child care providers, social service providers, and community members for CYSHCN.

- Smaller counties (40) = require a 0.5 FTE
- Larger counties (11) = require a 1.0 FTE
- New York City DOHMH = requires 2 FTEs



LHD CYSHCN Activities

- Collaboration and Resource Development
- Outreach, Engagement, and Community Promotion
- Coordination of Community Resources
- Transition Services
- Family Satisfaction
- Health Equity
- Database





CYSHCN 2020-2021

Total # of CYSHCN in the Program = 982 Total # of CYSHCN referred from EI = 331

CYSHCN SS

Treatment

- Children ages 0-21 who live in NYS who have a physically disabling condition or severe chronic illness deemed eligible by the <u>county</u> that the child lives in
- Meet medical and financial eligibility criteria in their county of residence
- 50/50 LHD match
- 25 LHDs participate



Diagnostic & Evaluation

- Children ages 0-21 who live in NYS who have a physically disabling condition or severe chronic illness
- Reimburse specialty providers for the diagnosis & development of a treatment plan for eligible children
- 100% paid by federal funding, not LHD



Regional Support Centers (RSC)




Regional Support Center (RSC) Activities

- Provide technical assistance to LHDs to improve systems, supports, and outcomes
- Increase LHD knowledge of resources for CYSHCN
- Develop and maintain an online Resource Directory
- Enhance parents' skills and confidence to navigate systems of care
- Engage communities and provide social support
- Provide a continuous family feedback loop
