FUNDING MUST KEEP PACE WITH COSTS

The cost of operations has increased by 31.85% since 2017, but state funding remains flat

NEW AND EXPANDED RESPONSIBILITIES ERODE FUNDING

- Review and monitoring of infrastructure upgrades and water quality standards

DRINKING WATER ENHANCMENT FUNDING LAGS INVESTMENTS IN CLEAN WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

NYS started investing \$500,000,000 annually beginning in 2017 through the Clean Water Infrastructure Act funding.

However, investments in Local Health Departments' Drinking Water Enhancement (DWE) funding experienced a 16% reduction between 2009 and 2013, and has remained at the 2013 levels since.

DWE funding supports monitoring and oversight activities protecting drinking water infrastructure and represents just 1% of New York's investment in clean water.

INVESTMENTS IN DRINKING WATER ENHANCEMENT PROGRAMS WILL IMPROVE PROTECTIONS FOR NEW YORKERS

Increasing DWE funding funding will allow LHDs to:

- Assure that drinking water systems fully comply with regulatory mandates
- Conduct timely inspections and water quality testing
- Protect New York residents from emerging contaminants
- Hire and retain qualified engineers to perform required plan reviews
