



Tick Borne Illness Trends in Allegany County





Project Background

✓ To provide needed resources and education for marginalized groups in rural areas that will protect against an increased occurrence of Lyme disease due to the impacts of climate change.

GOALS

Teach community members how to create a **tick-safe zone** around your home and **check for ticks**.

Provide Health education through targeted presentations that foster **a working knowledge of** early signs and **symptoms of Lyme disease** and other tick-borne illnesses.

Establish collaboration across the county to direct focus **on preventing tick-borne illnesses** and promoting safe methods for **tick removal**.

The Many Forms of Lyme Disease Rashes (Erythema Migrans)




